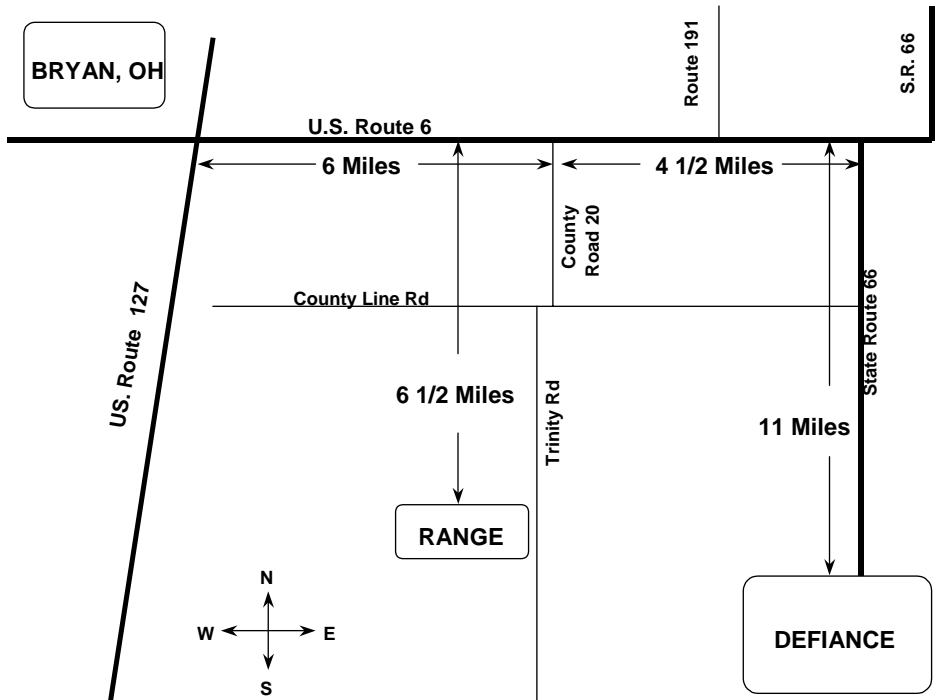

Greater Defiance Places of Interest

Independence Dam State Park: The original dam supplied water for the Miami-Erie and Wabash Canal Systems. The park features tent & RV camping, boat ramps above and below the dam, picnicking, fishing and hiking trails. Located Northeast of Defiance on US Route 424. (419) 784-3263

Northtowne Mall: An enclosed shopping mall featuring: J.C. Penney, Ames, Elder Beerman as well as a wide variety of specialty shops and dining. Located on State Route 66 near US Route 24. (419) 782-3189

Auglaize Village: A recreated rural 19th century village and farm museum. Located West of Defiance off US Route 24 on Krouse Rd.

Tri-State Yokefellow House: An ecumenical retreat center. Surrounded by grain fields and backed by the Tiffin River, with quiet walks leading to a nearby pond. (419) 428-2891.

The Defiance College: Four year liberal arts college founded in 1850 and affiliated with the United Church of Christ. Graduate programs in business and education. (419) 784-4010

Fort Defiance Park: Site of Fort Defiance, built by General Anthony Wayne in 1794. Scenic view and located at the confluence of the Maumee and Auglaize Rivers.

Sauder Village: Over 80 acres of living history. You'll find people dressed just like the early settlers practicing their crafts, as well as authentically restored buildings. The Barn Restaurant featuring buffet and family style servings. Admission \$9.50, children under 5 free. Hours M – Sat 10-5, Sun 1-5. Take State Route 66 North through Archbold; turn right on Route 2. (800) 590-9755

Bicycle Trail: Multi-Loop trail from Oxbow lake to Williams County. Rest stop at the Yokefellow's House. Located on Schick Rd off State Route 15. (419) 782-8551

Wildlife Orphanage & Rehabilitation Center: Devoted to the first-aid, care and rehabilitation and release of Ohio's wildlife. Tours available. Located at 14597 Power Dam Road. (419) 393-2400
